Easter Message from the Chaplain

The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it.

How fitting these words are from St John to sum up the great Paschal Feast that we are about to embark upon as we enter through Holy Week, into the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. I would urge you to attend and enter into these most sacred solemn liturgies in your parishes over these days ahead.

The darkness that overshadowed Our Blessed Lord on the night that He was betrayed, on that first Holy Thursday. The darkness that appeared to overwhelm Him on Good Friday as He was brutally crucified in such a barbaric fashion on the Cross. Dying out of love for you and me, to take away the sins of the world, the only acceptable, spotless sacrifice.

Darkness can invade our life in many ways, financial difficulties, the loss of a loved one, the addiction to alcohol or watching a loved one lose their way. Whatever form the darkness takes, we can still find meaning and strength in the light of the Eucharist Lord.

In the Eucharist at the Last Supper, Jesus had already lit the fuse of His Resurrection, foretelling His triumph when He would rise from the dead on Easter Day. Jesus takes away our sins on the Cross and triumphs over sin and death and gives us a new life and a share in His Resurrection.

From the beginning of Lent until now, we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. We await now with the whole Church to enter in to the solemn celebration of the Paschal Mystery, that is to say, of His Passion and Resurrection, the reason why Our Blessed Lord came to us here on earth.

It is with great joy that I wish you and your families a very happy and holy Easter.


